
## **Operation Ornament**

While our flu shot campaign remains a voluntary program, we hope to meet the challenge from the State of

Wisconsin Department of Health and Family Services to vaccinate

more than 80 percent of eligible Luther Midelfort employees. All employees are expected to return a completed Consent/Declination Form to the Employee Health nurse at their location by December 31, 2007. Print a copy of the Consent/Declination Form posted on LEO under Employee Resources. If you intend to receive a flu shot, save time by completing the form and bringing it with you to the flu shot clinic. If you do not want to receive a flu shot, complete the form, sign it and send it to the Employee Health nurse. Signing the declination allows us to document that all of our employees were offered the opportunity to receive a flu shot.

If you have questions, contact the Employee Health nurse at your location. Flu shots are most effective when given in November and December. However, we will continue to vaccinate as long as we have vaccine.
